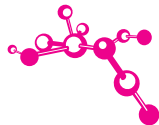
explainingDNA



Looking at the Biblical examples, we discover a few basic principles that groups of believers lived by:

- devoted to the Word
- authentic relationships
- partners in the Great Commission

threeELEMENTS



an easy way to remember these three basic principles is the abbreviation DNA

divineTRUTH

the Bible and the Holy Spirit

nurturingCOMMUNITY

marked by honesty and confessing sins

apostolicMISSION

being sent with the gospel to those who don't yet believe

divine TRUTH



commit to reading scripture together

find CONTEXT

The best way to understand the Bible is to read scripture in context, and the best way to do this is to read through one chapter at a time.

We recommend starting in the book of Luke and commit to reading daily. This will take about 15-30 minutes a day.

One of the best tools to help establish this time is the “four sevens” booklet that can be found at www.crupress.com. If you need help find this material, please ask a CCC staff member.

divine TRUTH



commit to reading scripture together

discuss CONTENT

What was the basic idea of the passage? Discuss the questions that each of you had and together seek to understand what the passage means.

If you still have questions don't hesitate to ask a trusted friend, discipler/mentor, or your staff coach for some perspective.

After discussing the passage, write down one application point that you can implement in your life during the coming week.

nurturing COMMUNITY



the context of your time practicing DNA is your relationship with each other.

admit WEAKNESS

What would it be like if you were open and honest with the people around you about how you don't measure up to the standard that Jesus sets in the Bible?

Can you imagine a life free from habitual sin and the guilt that it brings?

The Bible promises that if we confess our sins (how we've fallen short of living the life that Jesus did) God is faithful and will forgive us.

nurturing COMMUNITY

the context of your time practicing DNA is your relationship with each other.

callout GREATNESS

What if you could discover how God has given you distinct gifts and find out who God has made you to be?

The Bible teaches that God created each one of us uniquely and has given us different gifts to serve Him. God has thus placed greatness in you, though it may be hard to see at times.

We as a community should be in the habit of recognizing those particular gifts and calling greatness out in one another.

apostolicMISSION



invite others to be a part of your DNA group

beMISSIONAL

How could God use you to make a spiritual impact in the world around you if you let Him?

The word apostle literally means “sent one.” The Bible teaches that Jesus commanded Christians to go into the world on a mission.

The mission is quite simple; Tell others about Jesus and invite them to experience a community of Christians living out DNA.

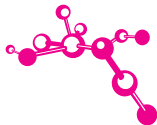
what if there was DNA everywhere...

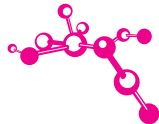
